## Our Latest Rescues

**Lexi** – is an Arabian chestnut mare, in her 20's. She came to us, along with Scout, in very malnourished condition. They both suffered from tape worms and fungus, Lexi had a uterine infection and their feet had not been trimmed in a very long time. After having 5 inches trimmed off their hooves and their teeth floated, we trailered them to our facility where they have been responding very well to the feed and loving care provided by our members and volunteers.

**Scout** – is a paint grade mare in her late 20's. In addition to the above, she suffers from arthritis in her knees. But, both horses have that spark back in their eyes now and enjoy being handled. Once they finish filling out, they will be up for adoption.

**Chevy** – is a 5 y/o bay Mustang mare that was given up to us because she suffered from a wound to her neck that had not been tended and was under weight. She's doing very well, gaining weight and her wound is healing well after minor surgery. She responds well to calm handling and trailers nicely. Soon she will be looking for a loving new home.

Got dust in your hay? Go soak your head – er – hay. Literally! Soak each flake just prior to feeding. It not only takes care of the dust, it rehydrates it, making it close to fresh cut. Drill a few small holes in your feeder to allow for drainage. The horses love it!!

Do you know that for as little as \$25 a month, you can make a difference in a starved or abused horse's life?

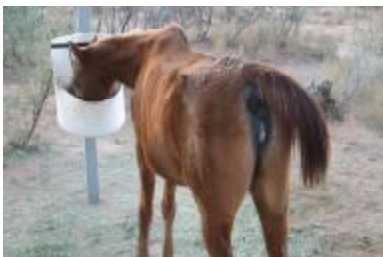
They need your help – help us to help them.
