Dash – a very sweet 3-year-old gelding. He will mature to about 14.1HH and will make a great horse for someone.

Dash has great ground manners and is now ready to learn to ride. He has already been saddled and bridled, but needs someone with horse knowledge to teach him what fun it is to ride. Because Dash is on the smaller side, he will require a petite rider or older child with riding experience.

This is a very sound little horse and loves attention.

Pal – a very sweet, laid-back 28-year-old gelding. Pal is looking for a home where he can do very light riding for kids or lighter adult. He rides beautifully, clips and is a dream to handle.

He has already gained about 500 pounds, but will need to gain an additional 200 to get up to a “normal” weight. His face is paralyzed on the right side. It appears that he has been beaten with a blunt object some years ago. The paralysis does not seem to bother him. He eats senior feed, beet pulp and hay.

It currently costs about \$200 per month to feed Pal as he is requiring major feed to put weight on.
