We recently received an elderly horse—in his very late twenties—who is thin and has a ham string injury that is quite severe. If you go by first impressions, you would think that Spirit should just be put down. But if you take a closer look, you will see Spirit's bright eyes. You will see that he loves attention as much as he likes carrots. You will see that Spirit is aptly named, and that he needs someplace where he can live out his remaining days to the fullest. We searched to find that place, but it was difficult to find a family who wanted a pet for just a short while.

One day a miracle happened. Out of the blue, I received a call from Cindy Normandu, owner of High Desert Stables located in Palominas.

During our conversation I asked her if she might be interested in taking Spirit and letting him roam about on her acreage along with another horse named Mr. T., who also enjoys life too much to be put down just yet. Much to our delight, CFH was able to come to an agreement where Spirit will reside at High Desert Stables. He will have his own stall and the freedom to roam about for the rest of his life.

CFH, however, needs to supply his hoof trims, shots and worming, as well as the money for his monthly feed bill.

Enter Bill Singer and his wife, who board a horse at High Desert Stables. They and some friends help provide care and feed for Mr. T., and have come up with a way to help Spirit too.

Bill makes beautiful semi-precious gemstone bracelets in his spare time. They sell for \$15 to \$20, and Bill will donate all the proceeds from the sale of these bracelets to help sponsor Spirit and Mr. T.

Rancher Waits Too Long to Get Help for His Horses

CFH received an influx of horses in late February. Two of the horses were from a local rancher who decided that his horses were too thin and too old to take care of. We received the horses on a very cold and rainy Monday, perhaps an omen of things to come.

The horses had been used to grazing on ranch land with little vegetation and limited access to water. Due to the sudden change in diet and the extremely harsh weather we experienced, the horses became very ill. One horse started drinking too much water and almost drowned himself a few times. He had to be dragged away from the water. This poor horse had kidney failure, and it wasn't long before he went into convulsions and passed away.

His pasture mate, who weighed in at 450 pounds, lasted a few weeks more. However, he just could not gain weight, was severely depressed, and passed away on his own one evening.

These animals needlessly suffered. **Please**, if you have horses that you know you cannot adequately feed, call us before it is too late for us to help them. We would much rather put our dollars to use working with horses who can be rehabilitated to make fine pets for adoptive families than spend it on hiring expensive backhoes to have horses buried.

Time to Vaccinate

Spring is here! Remember to vaccinate your horses and any other animals you have. It takes almost six weeks for vaccinations to take full affect.

If your horse has never had shots before, you will need to give the first set of of shots now and follow up with a booster in a few weeks. Your horse will then be protected for a year. Next spring, you will need to give only a booster.

There were cases of West Nile reported in Cochise County last year, so it is a very good idea to vaccinate against that in addition to rabies, which is becoming a big problem these days.

If you are not sure which vaccinations to give, get your veterinarian's recommendations. At the minimum, you should always administer the three-way shot, which vaccinates against standard Eastern, Western influenza, and tetanus toxoid. You can also vaccinate against other diseases, such as Rhino. Potomac Fever, etc.

It is always best for your veterinarian to give the shots. However, if you are experienced, you can purchase the shots and administer them yourself.

If you have not wormed your horse in the past year, now would be a good time to take care of that too.
